The role of National Contact Points is to further the effectiveness of the Guidelines by undertaking promotional activities, handling enquiries and contributing to the resolution of issues that arise relating to the implementation of the Guidelines in specific instances. NCPs will operate in accordance with core criteria of visibility, accessibility, transparency and accountability.

14 representatives from different stakeholder groups: employer associations, trade unions, business associations, NGOs, academia (each group having 2 representatives in the advisory board), as well as 2 departments of the federal administration: 2 representatives of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs FDFA (political direction, development agency) and 2 representatives of the Federal Department of Economic Affairs, Education and Research EAER (labour direction, international trade direction). The advisory board is co-chaired by State Secretary Marie-Gabrielle Ineichen-Fleisch, Director of the State Secretariat of Economic Affairs, and Professor Christine Kaufmann, Chair for Constitutional and Administrative Law and for European and International Law of the University of Zurich.

Functions: the advisory board advises the NCP on its strategic orientation as well as on the implementation of the OECD Guidelines and the procedural guidelines of the NCP according to the core criteria of visibility, accessibility, transparency and accountability. The advisory board also promotes the dialogue between stakeholder groups and contributes to the effective implementation of the OECD Guidelines.

The advisory board advises the NCP on procedural issues, such as the cooperation with other NCPs and with stakeholders. The advisory board will also be consulted on issues such as modifications of the published procedural guidelines of the NCP, changes of the mandate of the internal working groups of the federal administration that handle specific instances, the selection of external mediators, the annual report of the Swiss NCP and promotional activities of the NCP. The advisory board will be informed about the handling of specific instances by the NCP (state of the proceedings, appointment of an internal working group of the federal administration for a specific instances). However the advisory board is not directly involved in the handling of specific instances.

C. Proactive agenda

In accordance with the Investment Committee's proactive agenda, NCPs should maintain regular contact, including meetings, with social partners and other stakeholders in order to: a) consider new developments and emerging practices concerning responsible business conduct; b) support the positive contributions enterprises can make to identify and respond to risks of adverse impacts associated with particular products, regions, sectors or industries

Against the backdrop of the importance of the financial sector in Switzerland and the prominent role played by Swiss banks in the discussion about the corporate responsibility to respect human rights, the Swiss NCP is actively engaged in the work of the OECD on environmental and social due diligence in the financial sector. Switzerland also financially supports the work stream of the OECD which aims to provide better guidance for financial institutions on the implementation of the OECD Guidelines and the UN Guiding Principles.

The Swiss National Contact Point has been involved in the work of the interdepartemental plattform on commodities, which published the "Background Report Commodities" in March 2013. This report also mentions the NCP as a grievance mechanism for specific instances related to the extractive sector. The NCP also provided information for the follow-up report on the implementation of the recommendations of the Background Report Commodities, published in March 2014.

Since the publication of the Background Report Commodities and the adoption by the Federal Council of 17 recommendations, the staff of the Swiss National Contact Point is actively engaged in following-up to the mandate of the government, in particular recommendations 10, 11 and 12 which relate to CSR:

Recommendation 10 (excerpt): Switzerland should continue in its commitment to promote corporate social responsibility and intensify the multi-stakeholder dialogue being conducted by the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA) and the Federal Department of Economic Affairs, Education and Research (EAER) on the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights.

Recommendation 11 (excerpt): A working group, in cooperation with representatives of the stakeholders involved (specifically, the cantons, as well as companies and NGOs) should prepare proposals for corporate social responsibility standards (including implementation mechanisms) for the commodity merchanting industry.

Recommendation 12 (excerpt): Based on the results of the comparative study of other legal regimes, possible legal options will be analyzed on environmental and human rights due diligence as well as on CSR reporting.

D. Co-operation and peer learning

In addition to contributing to the Committee's work to enhance the effectiveness of the Guidelines, NCPs will engage in joint peer learning activities. In particular, they are encouraged to engage in horizontal, thematic peer reviews and voluntary NCP peer evaluations. Such peer learning can be carried out through meetings at the OECD or through direct co-operation between NCPs.

The Swiss NCP maintained its cooperation and regular exchange with the German-speaking NCPs (Austria, Germany) and also strengthened contacts with other NCPs. 30. The Swiss NCP has already announced its interest to engage in a voluntary peer review during the meeting of the Investment Committee in October 2011. Given the recent modifications of its structure and the availability of the OECD Secretariat, a voluntary peer review would seem to be most effective and fruitful after a certain implementation period, i.e. in 2015.

Summary	Following the NCPs offer to facilitate a dialogue in its Initial Assessment the parties accepted this offer. The Swiss NCP contracted an independent mediator for the pre-mediation process and to lead a first mediation / conciliation meeting which took place in Bern on September 23, 2013. This specific instance has yet not been concluded, as the Swiss NCP is still engaged with the parties in facilitating follow-up actions.
