Bilateral Economic Relations Sanctions

Information Regarding the Interpretation of Name Entries in Annex 7

to the Ordinance on Measures against Syria¹

This notice contains important information for the interpretation of the name entries in Annex 7 and recommendations for the screening of the individuals and entities listed therein. It is not legally binding.

Compliance with the provisions of the Ordinance is the sole responsibility of the natural and legal per-

sons concerned.

Annex 72 to the Ordinance contains entries of physical persons who are subject to financial as

well as travel sanctions and legal persons which are subject to financial sanctions.

Name entries

The majority of physical persons listed in annex 7 have Arabic names. As a consequence of

the translation from Arabic into Latin script, names or name parts can be spelt differently. Ad-

ditionally and regardless of the spelling, persons can be known under different names. There-

fore Annex 7 applies a system of aliases (or a.k.a.'s) in order to list all names and name parts.

Hence, in annex 7 a.k.a.'s are defined as spelling variants of names or name parts in Latin

script by which listed persons are also known.

Generally, there are alternative Latin spelling variants for all name-parts. They are divided into

their type of name-part. The enumeration following letters (a.k.a. a), a.k.a. b), etc.) is making

reference to one type of name-part (given / family name and other name).

When applicable, additional spelling variants for each a.k.a. of the name part are added in

brackets.

Example: Amer al-Achi

Justification: Appointed Governor of the Sweida Governorate by President Bashar al- Assad on Jul 2016. Former Head of the intelligence branch of the Syrian Air Force Intelligence Service (2012- 2016). Through his role in the Air Force Intelligence Service, Amer al-Achi is implicated in the repression of the Syrian opposition. **Modifications:** Amended on 6 Nov 2013, 19 Jan 2016, 12 Jun 2018, 26 Jun 2020

"Good quality *a.k.a.* a)" refers to an alternative spelling of the given name; "Good quality *a.k.a.* b)" refers to a further given name; "Good quality *a.k.a.* c)" is making reference to the family name.

XML List

The <u>XML List</u> can only be read with specifically coded software. For reading the list, one needs the relevant <u>XML specifications</u>. The XML list contains all relevant information concerning listed persons in chronological order.

In the XML list, the names of physical persons are provided in both Latin and, whenever applicable, Arabic spelling. For technical reasons, the Arabic spelling is not available in the PDF version of the list.

Only the XML list provides an unambiguous reference to the type of name-parts composing the *a.k.a.* and its spelling variants, such as the given name (<given-name> in the XML file), the family name (<family-name> in the XML file) or any other kind of name (e.g. <whole-name>). In the PDF list, however, it is in most cases obvious to which name-part an *a.k.a.* is making reference to.

Combinations

The different name-parts (given and family name, in some cases also titles or further given names) and their *a.k.a.*'s as well as their spelling variants should be combined, sometimes generating an important number of full names, as seen in the example below. Any combination should at least contain one given name (<given-name> or <further given-name> in the

XML file) and one family name (<family-name> in the XML file). Lone given- or family-names do not require to be screened against individually. Combination with titles remains possible.

⚠ In some cases, the list provides whole name *a.k.a.*'s (any name part that is labelled as whole-name *a.k.a.* in the XML list). They do not have to be combined with any other name part to be considered and stand as a name for themselves. Nevertheless, they can be combined with titles.

There are no combinations of Arabic (in the XML list provided as spelling variant of the main name) and Latin name parts.

Example: Amer al-Achi

Given name: Amer.
Family name: al-Achi.
Title: Major General.

A.k.a. given name: Amis, spelling variant Ammar in brackets.

A.k.a. further given name: Ibrahim.

A.k.a. family name: al Ashi, spelling variants Aachi and Ashi in brackets.

As a consequence, there exist 56 possible combinations:
