

OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises: National Contact Point of Switzerland (NCP)

Treatment of specific instances: role and mandate of the ad hoc working groups

The Swiss NCP treats specific instances according to its "<u>Information on Specific Instance</u> <u>Procedure</u>" (published on the NCP website). The procedure follows five steps:

- Step 1: Confirmation and Information
- Step 2: Initial Assessment
- Step 3: Providing a platform for dialogue to the parties
- Step 4: Conclusion of the procedures
- Step 5: Feedback to the NCP

Each step includes several actions and different actors, including the ad hoc working groups. Ad hoc working groups are led by a representative of the NCP Secretariat and include experts from the federal administration. Their composition depends on the topics of the submission. For each chapter of the OECD Guidelines, a federal office is designated as a specialist unit (see Annex A).

As each submission faces specific challenges, the actions can be adapted allowing for a pragmatic and solution-oriented approach.
